



Dear Friends




Vacation Bible School (July 1st - 5th):




Teen Camp (July 22nd - 25th):



Our teens enjoyed a life-changing experience at camp, with many opportunities provided for spiritual growth. Our theme was: "Jesus, Name Above All Names." Teen camps are very special; they allow us to separate the church teens from the world and have them focus on Christ, where they grow in faith and enjoy fun activities. We can also emphasize the importance of separating from the world, fashion, and worldly entertainment. For example, girls are not allowed to bring pants; we provide culottes for the camp period, which was a new experience for all but one girl. They experience what we take for granted: morning devotion. Although they are taught the need for devotions in Sunday school, many of them lack the support at home to encourage them or be an example. At camp, we provided a time in the morning for personal and group devotions and had a preaching session every night.











Summer Reading Program (July 14-August 4):



For seven weeks, we hosted a reading program that encouraged children to read while earning points to trade for school supplies. It was amazing to see their enthusiasm for learning and their dedication to improving their skills. More importantly, we had several chances to share the love of Christ through this outreach. Books could only be exchanged after the Sunday night and Thursday night service, so we had a great turn out of families during those evening services. Church School (Opened July 19th): Heritage Baptist Academy








