• On each of the six days of the medical clinic, we saw an average of over 250 people, and there were over 600 professions of salvation!

• The church in Naivasha was started November 10th. They had a beginning attendance of over 200, and 8 came forward for salvation.

• Eight boys made a profession of salvation during the church's "Coming of Age" event.

• We housed four groups of guests. The first was our mission board director and his family. We loved having them here, and they were a huge encouragement to us.
